Also listed in your monthly newsletter are any changing or hanging dates for these exhibits. As always, properly prepared for hanging: framed, wired (no sawtooth hangers), and within the size limit if specified. No nudes in the Community Center and tasteful for restaurants, after all folks are eating.

If your art should sell at any of our sites you are subject to a commission of 25%. Treasurer Gloria Dunn has forms and will accept your payment. At the Community Center one of the Coordinators will help with the sale. At the other sites, your phone number is on the price card attached to the art, so it is up to you to handle the transaction and contact Gloria Dunn.
